The changing Customs landscape is far from complete. In fact, at the time we have sent out this communication, the Rules which indeed play a significant role in Customs compliances and support to the legislation, have only in part, been circulated for comment recently.

GMLS has already been delivering training programmes pertaining to the new Customs legislative framework since its original publication in 2009. Furthermore, GMLS has, via its University associations, generated research and reconciliation to the international WCO Customs instruments that drive the new South African Legislation, namely the Revised Kyoto Convention (RKC) and the SAFE Framework of Standards.

Since the introduction of the Control Act 31 of 2014 and the Customs Duty Act 30 of 2014, GMLS has already been delivering training across the country and at various Universities.

In collaboration with SAAFF and TETA, GMLS is rolling out the undermentioned Customs Skills Training Programme to over 450 learners country-wide. This on-line training programme is free of charge to various learners and the new Customs legislation is already written into all of the Customs Training Modules.

In the recent 5 months, GMLS, assisted by Lexis Nexis Expert Leon Marais and other local and regional SADC Customs Specialists, has cross-referenced the old and new legislation. Accordingly, all the key criteria of Classification, Valuation, Origin and Customs legislation material have all been fully updated.

The North West University has also embraced Customs Professional Training and will be in conjunction with GMLS delivering NQF 7 and 8 Programmes in line with the WCO PICARD Standards.

The first Course will commence from November 2014 when it is expected that all the Rules will be published by SARS.
